7 Mil Operating Levy

What does a Mil cost?

A mil produces \$1.00 in tax revenues for every \$1,000.00 of assessed value of property it is levied against. The assessed value is computed at 35% of the market value of a home.

<i>House valued at \$100,000:</i>	At 7 Mil
<i>Assessed Value at :</i>	35%
	(100,000 x .35)
<i>Assessed Tax Value:</i>	\$35,000
<i>Millage:</i>	0.007
	(35,000 x .007)
<i>Cost/Year before reduction:</i>	\$245
<i>Less 10% reduction factor:</i>	90%
	(245 x .90)

Actual cost per year with reduction: \$220.50

Actual cost of the levy for an owner of \$100,000 home is \$18.38 per month. That's 61 cents a day to help provide a child with an education....

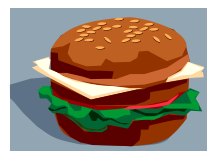

CHILD FIND Identification of Children with Disabilities

The Field Local School district is in the process of locating, evaluating, and identifying children from birth to age 21, residing in the district, who may be entitled to a Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE), including special education and related aids and services, pursuant to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act (IDEA) or Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Section 504).

Children eligible for FAPE under the IDEA are those with disabilities such as Autism, Multiple Disabilities, Deaf-Blindness, Hearing Impairment, Visual Impairment, Speech or Language Impairment, Orthopedic Impairment, Emotional Disturbance, Intellectual Impairment, Traumatic Brain Injury or Specific Learning Disability.

Children eligible for FAPE under Section 504 include children who have a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits a major life activity. If you know of a child who may have a disability or a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits a major life activity, or if you would simply like additional information, please contact Megan Longfellow, Director of Special Services at 330 673 2659.
